POLITBAROMETER #20(54), April 2021

The “Sant Maral” Foundation presents the results of the survey, conducted from April 1 to April 16, 2021. This time due to the COVID-19 restrictions, the representative sample of 1210 respondents were collected by CATI in the capital Ulan Bator and 21 aymags (split proportionally by 4 regional divisions and Ulan Bator). In the data below, tabulations are sorted by “capital,” “countryside,” and “nationwide” when relevant.

25 years of the Sant Maral Foundation surveys

The Sant Maral Foundation started its empirical research shortly before parliamentary elections of 1996 when Mongolia’s political, social, and economic transformation process had been ongoing for some years and political actors as well as the general public were in need of independent and unbiased assessments of developments. Based on opinion polls conducted in a scientific manner, the Sant Maral Foundation provided such assessments of public perceptions on a regular basis and began publishing its findings widely in the “Polit Barometer” which by now has been a reliable source of valuable information for 25 years.

Scientific professionalism, transparency, and unbiased analysis have been key issues in creating and maintaining the high standard of “Politbarometer” which is appreciated by political decision makers just as much as by students of relevant subjects and by international observers of Mongolia’s development. Especially the independence from influence of political parties gives the Sant Maral Foundation’s research credibility. What is published in the “Politbarometer” are the perceptions of people as found out during the interviews without a party-biased filter obstructing views that may not please certain political circles to satisfy others.

The Sant Maral Foundation has achieved these high standards through the professionalism of its members and staff and through international co-operation and exchange of experience. Study tours to world-known research institutions in the USA and Europe and participation in international conferences and seminars helped the Foundation’s staff to stay in touch with international developments in the field of empirical research. The Konrad Adenauer Foundation of Germany was among the Sant Maral Foundation’s international partners in this field and as resident representative of the Konrad Adenauer Foundation in Mongolia I had the opportunity to work closely with the Sant Maral Foundation during the initial years. Moreover, I have maintained a close relationship with the Sant Maral Foundation after my retirement and worked together with the Foundation to publish two compilations of research findings from the years 1995 to 2005 (“Voters Voices” Vol. I) and 2008 to 2016 (“Voters’ Voices” Vol. II). These publications provide analyses of long-term developments which complement the observations in the “Politbarometer” showing the situation at a specific moment.

During the past 25 years the Sant Maral Foundation's "Politbarometer" has established its place as an important source of information regarding people's opinions on political, social, and economic developments in Mongolia during and after the country's transformation process. The "Politbarometer" reflects these opinions and provides reliable analyses of these data. It has been a pleasure being associated with the Foundation's work.

25 years passed since the SMF has started to survey opinions of Mongolian people. The unrestricted opinion was an integral part of the new political system that was adopted by Mongolian population in the 1992 Constitution. During the past 25 years, we were trying to inform the population and decision makers about major problems facing the country and the public assessments of the governance. The SMF believes that there was enough need in the new and democratic society for the public concerns to be openly voiced. On the one hand, a display of a variety of opinions and an ability to find a compromise between opposing views is a sign of a growing maturity in a society. On the other hand, without a reliable feedback on the impact of its policies, any governance is doomed to fail. We hope that our findings on diverse and pressing issues such as strategic mining, social and income discrepancy etc. helped to address and promote good decision-making. Especially, considering that starting from 2013 we are surveying attitudes of Mongolians toward strategic mining ownership and management, which is increasingly an issue of national concern and future development. Judging by some reactions and comments our findings were a big surprise both for politicians and investors.

On behalf of the SMF, I would like to express a special gratitude to the Konrad Adenauer Foundation that was supporting our activity for 25 years. This support helped us not only to maintain independence from political influence, but also to continuously improve our level of professionalism. It also meant that the Politbarometer became the only openly and freely accessible longitudinal study of its kind in Mongolia. Today with their support of our growth we have many other partners such as Gallup with which we are participating in the World Poll that covers 150 countries, and the Asia Foundation with which we are conducting the "Corruption Benchmark survey", that is well known to Mongolian public.

Although some signs of negative trends are emerging today in our society, such as public voices should not be too loud and rather limited to a whisper into some elitist ears, the SMF believes that as long as voters are present, we will continue to express their voices for another 25 years.

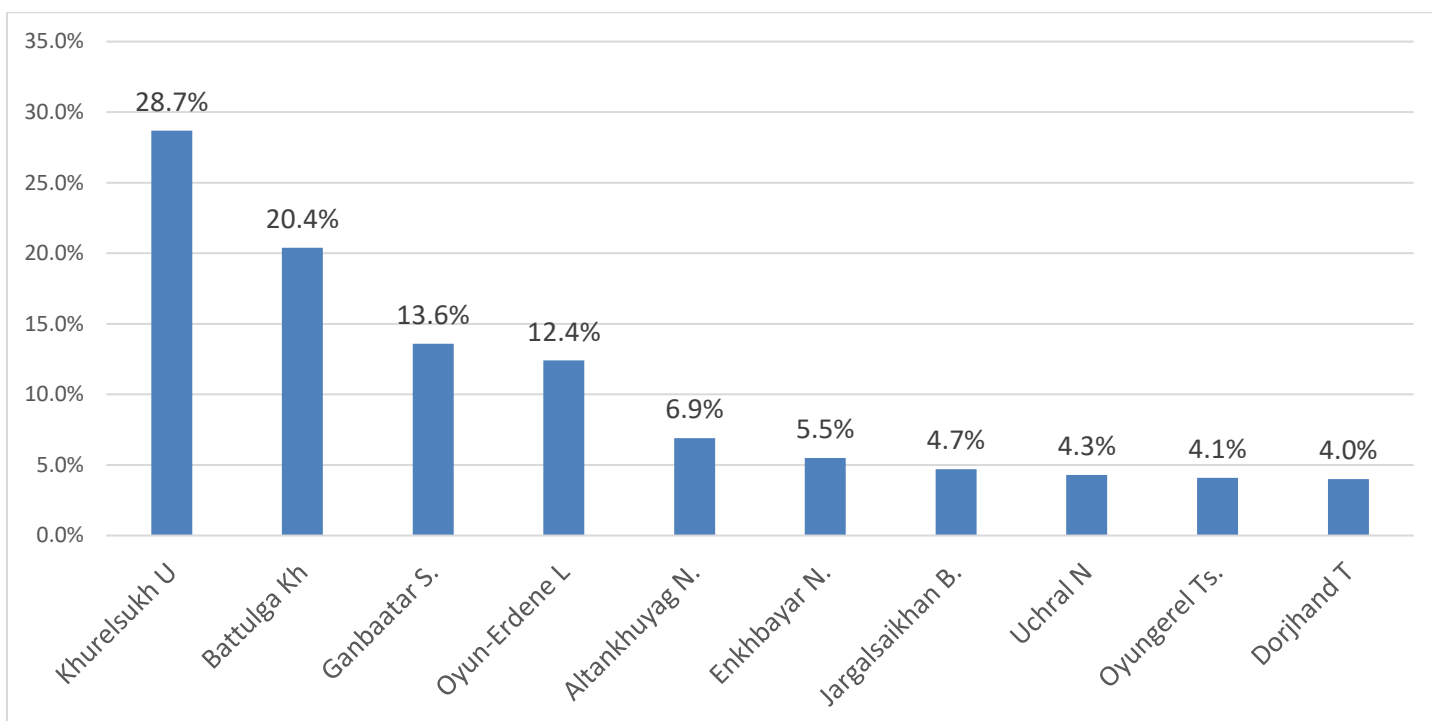
