



POLITBAROMETER #22(56), April 2023

The "Sant Maral" Foundation presents the results of the survey, conducted from March 18 to April 16, 2023. The representative sample of 1000 respondents were collected by CAPI in the capital Ulan Bator and Bulgan, Zavkhan, Umnugovi, Tuv, Khuvsgul and Sukhbaatar aymags (split proportionally by 4 regional divisions and capital Ulan Bator).

In the data below, tabulations are sorted by "capital," "countryside," and "nationwide" when relevant.


